I am happy to report the good news that membership in the McGivney is now more than 160,000 Order wide.

The Roman process of Investigation into Father McGivney's life and Holiness is nearing completion and the investigation into reported miracles is progressing. The Guild plays an important role in making Father McGuveny better known and spreading the word about his powerful intercessions.

As of January 1, 2017, the jurisdiction of New Jersey had 7,014 members. This is an increase of 575 members since August 1, 2015. Each day, the Supreme Council receives enrollments by mail and the Supreme Council website. Grand Knights can increase membership by furnishing the names and addresses of Council Members who wish to become members of the Guild to the State Office in West Orange. Those names and addresses will be forwarded to the Supreme Council. Please remember, there is NO FEE TO JOIN, nor are there any dues or other costs to join and each member will receive a bucketing from Supreme quarterly regarding the process being made in the Cause for Sainthood for Father McGivney.

FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK

While I realize Daylight Savings Time begins March 12 this year, I thought I would give a little info to those of us that didn't know when and why it began.

This Day in History

Daylight saving time instituted: FEB 9, 1942

On this day, Congress pushes ahead standard time for the United States by one hour in each time zone, imposing daylight saving time—called at the time "war time."

Daylight saving time, suggested by President Roosevelt, was imposed to conserve fuel, and could be traced back to World War I, when Congress imposed one standard time on the United States to enable the country to better utilize resources, following the European model. The 1918 Standard Time Act was meant to be in effect for only seven months of the year—and was discontinued nationally after the war. But individual states continued to turn clocks ahead one hour in spring and back one hour in fall.

The World War II legislation imposed daylight saving time for the entire nation for the entire year. It was repealed Sept. 30, 1945, when individual states once again imposed their own "standard" time. It was not until 1966 that Congress passed legislation setting a standard time that permanently superseded local habits.

Good Day Good People,



Break Out Of The Box


Communication with potential members, your current members and continuous membership growth should be the goal of all Councils. Council newsletters and websites have proven to be the most effective means of communication with members and prospective members. A good website serves the purpose of attracting men of the exact demographics that council's seek. Sophisticated web surfers will bypass websites that are boring or tedious to view. The New Jersey State Council encourages councils to maintain attractive, informative and up-to-date websites.

The State Council conducts a website contest, open to all councils in New Jersey. A winner will be selected from each of the five Dioceses of New Jersey. The criteria for judging will be as follows:

- > ACCESSIBILITY: A council's website should have an easy-to-remember URL.
- ➤ <u>APPEARANCE</u>: A visitor to a council's website will be more inclined to stay and search the site if it is pleasing to the eye.
- NAVIGATION: A good council website should have easy-to-use, easy-to-understand "buttons" to take a visitor to various areas of the site.
- **GRAPHICS**: A website's graphics should be of a high quality and thumbnails should open easily and to a size that is viewable within the screen.
- > **OFFICERS**: Council officers' roster should be listed, preferably with current photos.
- ➤ **ABOUT US**: There should be a section describing the Knights of Columbus, origin of the council, and current activities and projects.
- > **COMMUNICATIONS**: Current (and previous) newsletters / council bulletins should be posted on-line.
- **RECRUITMENT**: There should be a visible means for a prospective candidate to contact the council for further information and potential membership.
- LINKS: It is recommended that council websites have working links to other websites containing pertinent Knights of Columbus issues
- ➤ **GALLERIES**: Councils should always promote their activities and programs via photographs. Good galleries should contain photos promoting the hard work of a council as well as fraternal activities.
- 10 points are scored for each of the above categories, for a total of 100 points.
- Remember the four principles of the Knights of Columbus are Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism
- All entries must be received no later than March 31, 2017 utilizing the on-line form at www.njkofc.org
 Judging will take place April 1-5, 2017.
