The Spiritual Works of Mercy have long been a part of the Christian tradition, appearing in the works of theologians and spiritual writers throughout history. Just as Jesus attended to the spiritual wellbeing of those he ministered to, these Spiritual Works of Mercy guide us to "help our neighbor in their spiritual needs." *

- † Give advice to the doubtful
- † Comfort those who suffer
 - † Be patient with others
 - † Forgive injuries
- † Pray for the living and the dead

Corporal Works of Mercy

The Corporal Works of Mercy are found in the <u>teachings of Jesus</u> and give us a model for how we should treat all others, as if they were Christ in disguise. They "are charitable actions by which we help our neighbors in their bodily needs." They respond to the basic needs of humanity as we journey together through this life.*
