

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Lent always begins in the desert with Jesus.

One thing a desert has: space. Lots of space. Open space. Perhaps this is what Lent wants to help us create — space for Jesus in our lives, for prayer; space for others, for loved ones too easily taken for granted, for strangers too easily ignored, for the poor too easily forgotten; space for healing, renewal, recovery, reconciliation.

To create space in our homes we have to eliminate clutter. It's the same for the spiritual life. To create space for God we have to remove what is non-essential and distracting. It's ironic, to connect in real, meaningful ways with God and others (and even with ourselves) we first have to disconnect.

The desert is a good place to begin.

Lenten Connections

Daily Reflections to help you pray, journal, connect with God, others and yourself this Lent.

<u>1st Sunday in Lent, February 18</u>



Every Lent begins in the desert (Mk 1:12-15) where Jesus is tempted. When we walk through the "deserts" of our lives we are tempted to feel alone and unloved. Nothing

could be further from the truth — the Gospel Truth. In the next 40 days, God wants to show us how loved we really are.

<u>Monday, February 19</u>

God wants each of us to be holy. What does it mean to be holy? Pope Benedict said, "Holiness does not consist in never having erred or sinned. Holiness grows with the capacity for conversion, repentance, willingness to begin again, and above all with the capacity for reconciliation and forgiveness."

<u>Tuesday, February 20</u>

Is there someone in your life you need to forgive? Every time we recite the Lord's prayer, we ask forgiveness for ourselves that reflects how we have forgiven others. Forgiving another person melts the anger in your heart, provides peace for the other person and pleases our Father in heaven more than we can imagine.

<u>Wednesday, February 21</u>

On this day in 1972, Richard Nixon became the first U.S. President to visit China and began diplomatic relations between our two countries. A few years earlier, Nixon



had written: "There is no place on this small planet for a billion of its potentially most able people to live in angry isolation." This Lent can be a time to take the first step in reopening your own personal doors by reaching out to someone who has isolated themselves from you or that you have been estranged from and begin to form a new connection.

<u> Thursday, February 22</u>

Why a feast about a chair?? Well, there is an actual "Chair of St. Peter" housed at the Vatican in St. Peter's Basilica. This feast celebrates the special mission given by Christ to



Peter and all his successors (currently Pope Francis) to serve as the shepherd of the universal Church. In this gospel, Jesus asks his disciples a BIG question *"Who do you say that I am?"* (Matthew 16:15). Today may be a good day to spend time with this question (while sitting in a really BIG chair) ... how will we respond and how does our response affect the way we live?

Friday, February 23



Today is the Feast day of St. Polycarp. A pupil of John the Evangelist, Polycarp was a martyr and bishop who died for his unyielding faith to our Lord Jesus

Christ. He refused to compromise his beliefs and was burned at the stake. He also taught that one must pray, so as not to be led into temptation, fast, persevere and be joyful. He gave his life for Christ through his sacrifice, and gained eternal life.

Thinking of our own mortality, how will we sacrifice for the Lord on this Friday, and everyday, to gain eternal life??

Saturday, February 24

The 2018 Winter Olympics in Pyeongchang are coming to an end. Haven't they been inspiring to watch? This year South Korea invited their enemy, North Korea to participate in the games. Not everyone agreed with this gesture. Today, reflect on the goals of the Olympic games. Then take a minute to read Matthew 5:43-48. "Loving your enemies" is hard work.

Connecting with Jesus can redirect our focus away from our own anger or pain to be able to "love" our enemies. Jesus lifts our eyes and hearts toward God's love. God



knows and loves each of us even when we fail. We, too, must find ways to love others though they hurt us. When Jesus is in our hearts, our capacity for love is great.
