

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT/2018 LOUD AND CLEAR

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

I know it is strange to say that the story of Abraham and the Sacrifice of Isaac is one of my favorite Old Testament passages. I know it's even stranger to say I love Caravaggio's painting of the scene (I have it hanging in my residence).

How horrific, everyone says, that God would ask a man to sacrifice his son. That's what everyone focuses on when they hear this story.

It's the wrong thing to focus on. If you focus on that you miss the whole point: God *does not* want Abraham to sacrifice his son. It is God who sends the angel to withhold Abraham's hand. "Do not lay a hand on the boy," the angel says.

In the painting, notice the angel's hand gripping Abraham's wrist, holding him back. Focus on that. **That's** what God wants. This is a defining moment for Abraham *and* for Israel. Their God is not like "other gods" who demand human sacrifice. Their God does not want a hand to be laid on this boy or any child or any person. **God does not want** *any kind* **of destruction of human life.** This is the lesson

that is revealed by Jesus Christ who is the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets.

Sadly, it is a lesson slow to be learned even by those of us who love Jesus and try to follow Him.



The night before He died, when a follower of Jesus pulled out a sword to defend Him, Jesus told him to put it away. If you live by the sword, you will die by the sword (Mt. 26:52). He says it today to us.

I am as horrified as you are by what happened in Parkland, Florida. But I am equally horrified that anyone (especially a young person) can purchase an assault weapon. Quite honestly, I don't know what to make of a society that would allow it.

Change is necessary. Change in our laws. Change in our hearts. Much has been made that this latest mass shooting occurred on Valentine's Day, a day to celebrate love. It should not be forgotten, however, that it was also Ash Wednesday — a day that calls for conversion, for turning back to the Lord.

This evil done on a holy day calling for repentance and conversion challenges us to change in many ways. Here are two, as I see it: First, those of us who desire a change in our nation's laws to protect life in the womb, must work equally as hard to change our nation's laws in order to protect life in the classroom ... and at a concert, on a ball field, in a shopping mall, theater, church, in our homes and on our streets.

Second: our children need God in their lives. They need faith. Parents, *please*, bring your children to Church. This Sunday. Every Sunday. Faith is more important than sports, than video games. It is even more important than an A on a test. Faith in Christ forms us and frees us to love each other the way God loves. Faith also restrains us, holds us back from hurting others and ourselves.

Parkland sends a message loud and clear. As Jesus said, let us who have ears, hear it \dots and heed it.

Lenten Connections

Daily Reflections to help you pray, journal, connect with God, others and yourself this Lent.



Sunday, February 25

Jesus takes his friends Peter, James and John up a mountain where they experience him as more than a good teacher. Jesus is the Messiah. As you begin

each day this week, ask Jesus to take your heart to a special place, to show you more about Him, how He loves and calls us to love.

<u>Monday, February 26</u>

"Prayer is not asking. Prayer is putting oneself in the hands of God, at His disposition, and listening to His voice in the depth of our hearts" (*St. Teresa of Calcutta*). This Lent connect with the Lord in prayer each day, making time to hear His loving voice guiding you on your journey. It is here you will find peace.

<u>Tuesday, February 27</u>

God's invitation in today's first reading to "set things right" (Is.1:18) is a good summary of what Lent is about. The answer to what we need to do (and how) may be different for each of us. This week we are invited to seek answers in Scripture – a good place to start is with the Our Father, or with Jesus' words in Matthew 25, or the daily Mass readings (visit www.usccb.org). If you find a

word or passage that moves you, challenges you, comforts you or makes you angry, stay with it and pray with it. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you be



aware of how these words are inviting you to make things right with God and with those around you.

<u>Wednesday, February 28</u>

Jesus tells us He did not come to earth to be served, but to provide ransom for His people. Could anyone have imagined that an innocent man like Jesus would suffer death by crucifixion? Even harder to imagine is that Jesus would think we are worth saving, even to the point of dying for us! Take time today to meditate on all that Jesus has done to secure the salvation of our souls.

<u>Thursday, March 1</u>

"Blessed are they who have kept the word with a generous heart and yield a harvest through



perseverance." We begin National Women's History Month on the **Feast of Saint Agnes Tsao Kou Ying**, who was martyred for keeping the word by preaching the Gospel to the Chinese and refusing to deny her faith. While imprisoned, her spirit never failed as she prayed repeatedly, "God, have mercy on me; Jesus save me!" Has your perseverance shone through so far this Lent in your fasting, prayer and almsgiving? If you find yourself straying from your spiritual journey, let Saint Agnes inspire you to remember the words given to us on Ash Wednesday: "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel."

What a surprise to learn that today is **World Day of Prayer (WDP)!** This global, ecumenical movement led by Christian women welcomes all to join in PRAYER and ACTION for peace

and justice. While this annual celebration began very simply in 1887 in the USA, it is now celebrated in over 170 countries! WDP's motto "*Informed Prayer and Prayerful Action*," invites each of us to pray about how to care for others in greatest need while simultaneously caring for creation. Saturday, March 3

Today is the Feast day of Saint Katharine Drexel, one of our local saints, foundress of the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament in 1891. Guided by her spirit, the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament are still called to share the Gospel message with the poor, especially among the Black and Native American peoples. They challenge injustices in the world today, and oppose ALL forms of prejudice, racism and oppression. As Lent's journey continues, recall that our

spirituality and piety is strengthened by our differences & diversity. Reflect on what someone of a different race, ethnicity or religion has taught you. We are all Children of God.



MINISTRIES

CARITAS ENLIGHTENMENTS

The Caritas Ministry is dedicated to serving and supporting all of our parish members with special needs, so that they may participate fully in parish life. As we promote a welcoming parish community for all, some people may feel a little uncomfortable interacting with a person with a disability because of fear of saying or doing the wrong thing. The following suggestions may help you create positive experiences:

*Remember the Golden Rule - Treat all people as you want to be treated. Relax when communicating; let common courtesy be your guide. If misunderstandings arise, don't be afraid to repeat yourself or ask others to repeat themselves.

*Offer assistance by asking what is needed, but don't insist or be offended if your offer is declined.

* Respect the individual's personal space and auxiliary aids.

* Treat adults as adults no matter how severe a disability. *Always speak directly to the person, no matter what their age. Talk naturally to those who are non-verbal or use communication devices.

*Allow people to do things for themselves, even if it takes longer or results in mistakes.

*Encourage participation; personally invite all to share their gifts or acknowledge their participation.

*If words fail, a friendly smile says it all.

Above all, remember, despite individual differences we are all more alike than different; we are all made in the image and likeness of God.
