A CENTURION AND US

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

"Truly this man was the Son of God." A Roman centurion utters this at the foot of cross of a man he never met until he saw him crucified. Maybe he even helped in it.

Something changed in him. Something he saw. Something he heard. Something he felt. He changed. His life would never be the same again.

Truly this is the Son of God. Jesus Christ!

This week our liturgies will take us to the table where Jesus declares bread and wine to be His body and blood. They will take us to the foot of that same cross where the centurion stood. They will take us to the tomb. An empty tomb.

Truly, these liturgies, this holy week, is meant to touch us and transform us. I urge you to not let this week go by like any other week. Live it differently. Come to the liturgies and participate. Give your time. The three days we call the Sacred Paschal (Easter) Triduum are the heart and soul of our calendar because they celebrate the heart and soul of our faith. Come. Pray. Worship. Break bread. Have your feet washed. Walk to the cross — kiss it. Go to the tomb. Cry. Sing. Rejoice. Your life will forever be changed by the Son of God.

Lenten Connections

Daily Reflections to help you pray, journal, connect with God, others and yourself this Lent.

Sunday, March 25—Palm Sunday

Truly, this man was the Son of God." They are the words of a centurion at the foot of the Cross. What did he see in Jesus' face, in his eyes, what did he hear from Jesus' lips, that led him to this astounding profession of faith? What did he witness that day that made him a believer? How do we show *that* Christ to the world today?

Monday, March 26

"Hope lies in dreams, in imagination and in the courage of those who dare to make dreams into reality."

On March 26, 1953, Dr. Jonas Salk announced that he successfully tested a vaccine against poliomyelitis, the

virus that causes the crippling disease of polio, one of the worst epidemics of the 20th century. Salk's desire was not one of personal profit but "to be of some help to humankind." When asked who owned the patent to the vaccine, Salk replied: "There is no patent. Could you patent the sun?" Imagine the viruses of the world that can be prevented when we all open our hearts to Jesus and trust our dreams to Him - our Sun ... our Vaccine to eradicate hatred, intolerance, violence, addictions, loneliness ... our Hope for eternal life for all humankind!

Tuesday, March 27

Each day in Holy Week is a sacred time to enter more deeply into the suffering and passion of Jesus. Pope Francis' words may help guide our interior journey: "Pray for the patience to carry our own cross, not to refuse it or set it aside, but rather, in looking to him (Jesus), to take it up and carry it daily." Let's pray for all who suffer around the world and for the courage and strength to keep our eyes on Jesus and follow him – wherever he leads us.

Wednesday, March 28

Holy Wednesday, or Spy Wednesday gets its name because on this day, Judas betrayed Jesus to the Sanhedrin. Judas is thought to be sneaky, and his actions conjured up the image of a spy. All the Gospels include an account of the betrayal. In contrast (Jn.19:38) upon hearing of Jesus' death, and as a sense of duty, Joseph of Arimathea, a member of the Sanhedrin and a "secret disciple" of Jesus decides that, since Jesus is Jewish, His body should not be left on the cross on the eve of the Sabbath. He

asks Pilate if he may take away the body of Jesus and give him proper burial. Interesting contrast. Jesus is betrayed by one of his own followers, yet an act of kindness is extended by a member of the group opposed to Jesus. On the eve of Easter Triduum, let us prepare with a clean heart. May Joseph be the one we pray to when trying to be kind to someone we are at odds with. May we think of it as a gift to Jesus.

Holy Thursday, March 29

So Lent ends and the Triduum begins. At Holy Thursday's *Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper*, we remember that the hour has come when Jesus must pass from this world to the Father (Jn. 13:1). Yet

Jesus still has much to teach us. Though Master and teacher, Jesus defies all custom by assuming the role of a slave or servant throughout the Triduum.

Tonight he takes towel and basin and washes the feet of the apostles. They are

Tonight he takes towel and basin and washes the feet of the apostles. They are disturbed by this, especially Peter. Humiliating? Yes. This is just wrong in their view. However, in God's terms, it is a

lesson for them and for all of us in servant leadership. Jesus says, *I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do* (Jn. 13:15). If we are to follow Jesus, how do we accept God's terms and serve others as Jesus does with complete self-giving? Let us thank God for the gift of salvation and pray for the grace to have the will and courage to live as Jesus teaches.

Good Friday, March 30

When we look at the Cross today, we often think of darkness and despair and yet, it is also a testament to the great love of our Father in heaven through the sacrifice of His only Son. We each carry our own crosses at times. It is in the darkness of those crosses we bear, that we can say yes to God as Jesus did. We can say "Thy will be done," knowing that He is with us through our trials and will move us from the darkness into His Light, the light of His Promise. We can connect with the Lord in our darkness, when we need Him most and experience the joy of His great love.

Holy Saturday, March 31

Holy Saturday is a day of sorrow and anticipation, the period between the sadness of the cross and the joy of Easter. As we go from the crucifixion to the resurrection it is easy to overlook the importance of the tomb. Today, before you start preparing for Easter, spend some time in silence – no phone, no tv, no internet. Tonight, at the Easter Vigil, we will rejoice: the light of Christ will dispel the darkness. But first, enter into the silence. Let God find you today in the stillness of the tomb.
