Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Lent began on Valentine's Day. It snowed on the first day of Spring. It was an unusual Lent, to say the least. And now somehow it seems appropriate that Easter Sunday should fall on April Fools Day.

April Fools Day is a day for tricks. Perhaps someone today will tell you something or do something a little bit shocking (or mildly surprising) and then smile and say to you, "*April Fools!*" This is exactly what God does to the devil, to death, to sin. You see, with Jesus dead on the cross on Friday, the devil thinks he has his victory. Sin and death defeat God. Game, set, match: devil wins.

Nope. *April fools!*

When you seem to vanish from our sight: *Make our hearts burn within us.*

When we celebrate your love for all people at Mass: *Make our hearts burn within us.*

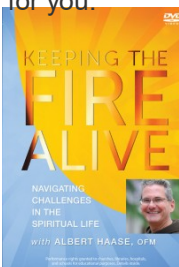

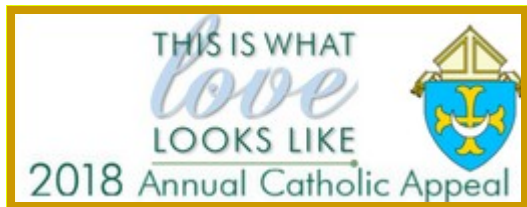
