#### **SOLEMNITY OF THE NATIVITY OF JOHN THE BAPTIST/2018**

#### Less Me. More Jesus

Dear Parishioners and Friends.

Full disclosure: no one really knows the date of John the Baptist's birth. And, yet, every year the Catholic Church celebrates it on June 24<sup>th</sup>. What gives?

Because of John's importance in the life of Christ, the Church celebrates his birth (and his death, by the way, on August 29<sup>th</sup>). We place the date of John's birth on June 24<sup>th</sup> because it is near the summer solstice, when the days begin to get shorter. This is based on something John himself says:

"He (Jesus) must increase; I must decrease" (Jn. 3:30).

The Church places the Baptist's birth at a time when, in our part of the world, daylight is decreasing. It reminds us to do the same: we must decrease so Christ can increase. In other words, when there is a little less ego, a little less "attitude," a little less of own will, of "what I want when I want it," I am able to make room for more Christ in my heart, in my mind, in my attitude. More Christ in my life.

St. John the Baptist, pray for us! Help us to decrease, so Christ may increase!

#### **Traditional Program:**

- Monday or Tuesday afternoons and evenings
- Classes for Grades 1-5 from 4-5:15pm, Grades 6-8 from 7-8:15pm
- Maximum of 2 absences permitted.

#### **Home Study Program:**

- Offered for grades 3-6
- You teach your child at home one lesson using the provided program.
- Signed chapter tests are submitted to the Religious Education Office.
- You and your child are required to attend 3 activities throughout the year.

**Special Disciples:** Each child learns in a different method. For those students who need to have one on one attention or have a special need, we offer a class every other Sunday morning during the 9am Mass. We have certified Special Needs Catechists who work with your child.

- 2nd grade parents only

- You and your child attend a class once a month in the evening to reinforce what was taught at home.

# Doctor-Assisted Suicide:

## Fatally Flawed, Dangerous for Patients

#### CONTACT YOUR LEGISLATORS TO OPPOSE ASSISTED SUICIDE

On Monday, March 12, the Assembly Judiciary Committee released the Aid in Dying for the Terminally III Act (A1504). The bill will now be voted on by the General Assembly, possibly as early as June 21st. The bill would allow physicians to prescribe drugs to end the lives of terminally ill individuals considered to have six months to live.

The facts are clear - in California, in Vermont and in Oregon - states that have passed assisted suicide bills - insurance companies have denied individuals expensive healthcare coverage but offered them low cost drugs to end their life.

In an era of cost control and managed care, patients with lingering illnesses may be branded as a financial liability for the insurance company, and <u>decisions to encourage death</u> could be driven by reducing costs.
