

# WE ARE WHAT WE EAT

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Sr. Pat tells the story of a time many years ago when she was at a restaurant with the parish staff. After ordering their dinners, Fr. David Adams (an associate pastor here at SJA in the early 1990s, who had a consummate sense of humor), leaned over to Sr. Pat and whispered that ancient maxim: "Remember: we are what we eat." Then, he smiled.

She had ordered chicken. He: wild boar!

I hope it's not too gristly an example to illustrate an important point about who we are as Church. We partake in the Eucharist each Sunday. Christ gives us His body and blood as THE memorial of his death and resurrection; as a foreshadowing of the eternal feast to come; and also so that we might live as His body

St. Paul writes the Church in Corinth and says: "Now you are Christ's body" (1 Cor. 12:27). In this letter and also to the Romans (12:5), Paul elaborates on this theme. The Church isn't a building. It isn't primarily an institution. It is the mystical Body of Christ.

Every Sunday, of course, is a Corpus Christi, a feast of the most holy Body and Blood of Christ. But today, in a special way, we highlight and celebrate this great gift Christ gives us — His real presence in the Eucharist. He gives us this gift as part of His promise to remain with us till the end of time and, in the meantime, to be strengthened to live as His body here and now.

Individually, yes, we are members of Christ's body. But it takes all of us. It takes the unique gifts and talents, personalities and insights of each one of us to continue the work Jesus began.

Too often throughout the week I eat unconsciously and carelessly. It can't be that way on Sunday here at Mass. We must be fully awake to the gift we are receiving and consuming and becoming part of. Let our "Amen" be to all the Eucharist invites and includes us in: the very life of Christ, the heart of Christ, the mission of Christ.

https:// www.votervoice.net/ NJCC/campaigns/58391/ respond PRIORITY #1 - Nonpublic school transportation. The ceiling for nonpublic school transportation had been frozen at \$884.00 from the 2007-2008 school year until it was increased to \$1,000 in the Fiscal Year 2018 Appropriations Act. However, Governor Murphy's Fiscal Year 2019 Budget reduced the amount back to \$884. Please note the enclosed Talking Points for discussing nonpublic school busing with legislators and other interested individuals in order to restore the per-pupil amount to \$1,000. This involves no increase in State funding, but rather a shifting of money to best serve the needs of our students and their parents.

PRIORITY #2 - Governor Murphy's proposed 2019 Budget cut \$3.8 million from nonpublic school aid reducing it from \$101,603 million to \$97,803 million. The cuts were made in Nonpublic School Nursing Services and Technology Aid. Please note the enclosed Talking Points for discussing these accounts with legislators and other interested individuals.

PRIORITY #3 — We are requesting a Budget Resolution which would permit a nonpublic school to pool the aggregate of the school's funding for Nursing Services, Technology, and Security, in order to move the funds to where they best fit the needs of the students in the local school for that particular year. Once again, this involves no increase in State funding, but rather allowing funds to be utilized to best serve the needs of our students and their parents. Public school accounts already are "fungible," which means that the public school district can move within Budget lines the State funds in a given year to best serve the needs of their students.

OUR The New Jersey Catholic Conference and the New Jersey Network of Catholic School POSITION: Families seek:

- To restore the per-pupil transportation ceiling to \$1,000 by using funds currently in the Fiscal Year 2019 Governor's Budget. This is THE major issue for the Catholic schools.
- To restore the \$3.8 million removed from the nonpublic school accounts in the Governor's Budget for Nonpublic Nursing Services Aid and Technology Aid at least to the level of funding in the Fiscal Year 2018 Appropriations Act.
- To insert Budget language to permit the local nonpublic school to pool the State funds for Nursing Services, Technology and Security to serve the needs of the students more effectively.
