GOSPEL

Mt 13: 1-23

On that day, Jesus went out of the house and sat down by the sea. Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat down, and the whole crowd stood along the shore. And he spoke to them at length in parables, saying:

"A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path, and birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky ground, where it had little soil. It sprang up at once because the soil was not deep, and when the sun rose it was scorched, and it withered for lack of roots. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it. But some seed fell on rich soil, and produced fruit, a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold. Whoever has ears ought to hear."

The disciples approached him and said, "Why do you speak to them in parables?" He said to them in reply, "Because knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven has been granted to you, but to them it has not been granted. To anyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; from anyone who has not, even what he has will be taken away. This is why I speak to them in parables, because *they look but do not see and hear but do not listen or understand.*

Isaiah's prophecy is fulfilled in them, which says: *You shall indeed hear but not understand, you shall indeed look but never see. Gross is the heart of this people, they will hardly hear with their ears, they have closed their eyes, lest they see with their eyes and hear with their ears and understand with their hearts and be converted, and I heal them.*

"But blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear. Amen, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it.

"Hear then the parable of the sower. The seed sown on the path is the one who hears the word of the kingdom without understanding it, and the evil one comes and steals away what was sown in his heart. The seed sown on rocky ground is the one who hears the word and receives it at once with joy. But he has no root and lasts only for a time. When some tribulation or persecution comes because of the word, he immediately falls away. The seed sown among thorns is the one who hears the word, but then worldly anxiety and the lure of riches choke the word and it bears no fruit. But the seed sown on rich soil is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold. [For this weekend's readings, click here.](#)

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time/ 2023 "STOP THE CLOCKS"

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Something is wrong with our clocks, have you noticed? They are all moving too quickly. I am not quite sure who had a hand in this dastardly deed — the quickening of time — but whoever did this must be caught and punished! Time must slow down! And the sooner the better!

Here's my problem with time moving so quickly ... I am moving quickly right along with it. Moving so fast means missing opportunities to notice and reflect on and participate in the presence of Christ, the movement of the Holy Spirit, the in-breaking and opening up of the Kingdom of God — all of which occurs, according to our Scriptures today — rather slowly.

This is why Sunday is important. Sunday is meant to slow us down a bit. Sunday should be the slow day of the week. We have unfortunately made it look like every other day of the week. But Sunday wants to teach us how to notice, reflect on, participate in and give thanks for God's love unfolding in our midst, in our good times and bad, in our sufferings and joys, in our happiness and sorrows.

Every Sunday stops the clock and gives us a glimpse of what is eternal. And that should change the way we live out the minutes and hours of Monday through Saturday.

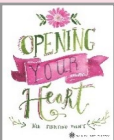

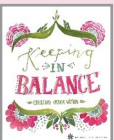
