

GOSPEL

Mt 13: 24-30

16th Sunday in Ordinary Time/ 2023

“GOD AND WEEDS”

Jesus proposed another parable to the crowds, saying: "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everyone was asleep his enemy came and sowed weeds all through the wheat, and then went off. When the crop grew and bore fruit, the weeds appeared as well. The slaves of the householder came to him and said, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where have the weeds come from?' He answered, 'An enemy has done this.' His slaves said to him, 'Do you want us to go and pull them up?' He replied, 'No, if you pull up the weeds you might uproot the wheat along with them. Let them grow together until harvest; then at harvest time I will say to the harvesters, "First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles for burning; but gather the wheat into my barn.'""

FAITH SHARING QUESTIONS

Any farmer knows the pain that comes with weeds. Jesus desires for us to be farmers – to care for His crop. He says: Yet, do not pull the weeds.

What are the weeds ... and how will you deal with them?

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

We expect God to be a weed-puller, even a weed-killer. That's the image of God many of us grew up with, an image many of us still have and an image many of us share with others in our conversations about how we think God handles "weedy people." God works like Divine Insecticide, which, in addition to weeds, also eradicates pesky, annoying, and sometimes dangerous, bugs.

God does away with "weedy and buggy people."

We are free to believe this, of course. But what do we say when we hear a parable like today's from St. Matthew? *Let the weeds grow. Don't pull them up, for fear of pulling up the wheat as well.*

Jesus shows us a different way to deal with those people we sometimes consider no better than weeds and bugs.

Maybe I will think differently the next time I encounter a spider.


