**EUCHARIST AND FORGIVENESS** 

24th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME/2023

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

In our Gospel today we see a man who is forgiven a huge debt but then in turn cannot forgive a smaller debt owed him. We can easily see how Jesus' parable wants us to show us how God readily forgives us much and then requires that we forgive one another. There may be another way of looking at the parable, as well.

Jesus, I believe, always shows us how we are in relationship with God and God with us. And this relationship is not a transactional one; it's not a tit for tat; it's not a "I did this for you so now you should do this for me." This is the way children think and act. When it comes to faith, God does not want us to be children.

Instead, God loves us unconditionally. Forgiveness comes with this kind of love. The more deeply we enter into this relationship, the more deeply we see our connection to all human life. And, too, I believe the more deeply we see our connection the more we understand how forgiveness heals and restores and mends relationships. We want to love and forgive each other not of fear of divine retribution, but because we want to share the abundance of love so freely given to us. The same love that makes us one.

This is the kind of love and forgiveness we share in the Eucharist every Sunday, because in the Eucharist we encounter Christ. This is how the Eucharist heals and restores and reconciles us to God and to one another.

### Peter approached Jesus and asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times. That is why the kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who decided to settle accounts with his servants. When he began the accounting, a debtor was brought before him who owed him a huge amount. Since he had no way of paying it back, his master ordered him to be sold, along with his wife, his children, and all his property, in payment of the debt. At that, the servant fell down, did him homage, and said, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back in full.' Moved with compassion the master of that servant let him go and forgave him the loan. When that servant had left, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a much smaller amount. He seized him and started to choke him, demanding, 'Pay back what you owe.' Falling to his knees, his fellow servant begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back.' But he refused. Instead, he had the fellow servant put in prison until he paid back the debt. Now when his fellow servants saw what had happened, they were deeply disturbed, and went to their master and reported the whole affair. His master summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you your entire debt because you begged me to. Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?' Then in anger his master handed him over to the torturers until he should pay back the whole debt. So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives
