Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come. A second time he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast." Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.' The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests."

FAITH SHARING QUESTIONS

In today's gospel, Jesus compares the kingdom of heaven to a wedding feast. He reminds us that God invites ALL of us to his kingdom of heaven.

How do we respond to God's invitation?

What does Jesus expect of those who accept his invitation?

Do you believe everyone is invited to have a place in heaven? Why or why not?

Today's parable gives us a good opportunity to remind those getting engaged to call the parish office to receive information on how to marry in Church. Dear Parishioners and Friends,

In today's Gospel, we hear yet another parable. This is how Jesus taught, with parables, with stories. This one is about a king throwing a wedding banquet for his son. "Invite anyone you see," says the king to his servants. The banquet is prepared. The king wants the room filled.

The parable reminds me of what Pope Francis said at the most recent World Youth Day back in August. With hundreds of thousands of young people, the Pope said:

"We are a community of brothers and sisters of Jesus, sons and daughters of the same Father. Friends, I would like to be clear with you who are allergic to falsehood and empty words: in the Church there is room for everyone, for everyone. In the Church no one is surplus, no one is surplus, there is room for everyone. Just as we are. All of us. And Jesus says this clearly when he sends the apostles to call us to the banquet of the Lord, who prepared it. He says: go and take everyone: young and old, healthy and sick, righteous and sinners. All of them. All. Everyone. In the Church there is room for everyone. Father, but today I am a wretch. Is there room for me? There is room for everyone. Everyone together, each one in his own language, repeat after me: Everyone! Everyone! Everyone! I can't hear you. Again: Everyone! Everyone! Everyone! And that is the Church, the mother of all. There is room for everyone. The Lord does not point his finger, but opens his arms; it is curious, but the Lord does not know how to do this, but he does that. He embraces us all. He shows us Jesus on the cross, who opened his arms so wide to be crucified and die for us. He never closes the door, never, but invites you in. Come in and see, Jesus receives, Jesus welcomes."

SYNOD NOTES

O Lord God, fill us with your Word and guide us to listen to others with respect. Help us to pray, discern, and walk together as disciples of communion, mission, and proclamation. Amen.

CONCERNS ABOUT THE SYNOD

Some folks have expressed a concern that the Synod is going to "change doctrine." It is important, therefore, to clarify what a Synod does and doesn't do. It discerns; it does not decide.

Some are concerned that there is voting at the Synod. You will recall we have said that lay women and men are full participants at this Synod, meaning they are voting members. But, again, we must remember, the Synod is not a legislative body, like Congress. It does not pass laws. It is there to advise the Pope, and in this case, it's purpose is too discern how we can be a Synodal Church, a Church that journeys together.

As the Synod participants gathered, Pope Francis said to them:

"We are not here to carry out a parliamentary meeting or a plan of reformation. No. We are here to walk together with the gaze of Jesus, who blesses the Father and welcomes those who are weary and oppressed. This gaze of the Lord that blesses also invites us to be a Church that, with a glad heart, contemplates God's action and discerns the present. And which, amid the sometimes agitated waves of our time, does not lose heart, does not seek ideological loopholes, does not barricade itself behind preconceived notions, does not give in to convenient solutions, does not let the world dictate its agenda."






