Two Real Worlds

The Pharisees went off and plotted how they might entrap Jesus in speech. They sent their disciples to him, with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are a truthful man and that you teach the way of God in accordance with the truth. And you are not concerned with anyone's opinion, for you do not regard a person's status. Tell us, then, what is your opinion: Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" Knowing their malice, Jesus said, "Why are you testing me, you hypocrites? Show me the coin that pays the census tax." Then they handed him the Roman coin. He said to them, "Whose image is this and whose inscription?" They replied, "Caesar's." At that he said to them, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

FAITH SHARING QUESTIONS

In today's gospel, the Pharisees, together with the Herodians, try to entrap Jesus by their question about the payment of taxes.

Jesus' answer to them changes their focus to the more important issue: We are called to love God and place God first in our lives.

In daily life, most of us have a number of responsibilities. Do we remember that God is our #1 priority? Do we ask God for help with our chores and our choices or to give us strength or clarity each day?

Pray this week that we keep things in proper perspective, remembering to keep God first in our lives.

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Jesus of Nazareth lived in the real world. Today's Gospel reading vividly illustrates this as Jesus is confronted by the Pharisees in a question about money.

The Pharisees are up to their old tricks, trying to trap Jesus. Is it lawful to pay taxes or not? Jesus asks to see a Roman coin (note: He doesn't have one on him). A Pharisee takes a coin out of his purse (note: he has one).

"Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar," Jesus says. "Give to God what belongs to God."

Jesus knows we live in a real world of money and business and earning a living and paying taxes and putting food on the table. Jesus also knows there is another real world, one beyond and bigger than the world that mints money.

Jesus does not tell us not to earn a living and put food on the table. He does tell us to give to God what belongs to God.

Our souls belong to God.

When we give our souls to anything or anyone other than God, we can usually expect to find trouble.

Is it possible to let the values of one real world (the one beyond and bigger) guide the decisions we make in the other real world (the one that requires a wallet)?

This is the question for us as individuals, for us as disciples, for us as a parish and Church. It is also a question for nations and rulers of people. When I consider all the recent atrocities and war in this real world, I wonder what kind of world we could make if we put into practice the values of the other real world, the one Jesus called "the Kingdom of God"? Peace, now more than ever!

FOR A SYNODAL CHURCH

Let's Journey Together!

This week, Synod participants are reflecting on the theme: **Co-responsibility in Mission—How can we live the call to be a listening Church that embodies co-responsibility in mission? How can we better share gifts and tasks in the service of the Gospel?**

Also, members of the Synod elected a commission to oversee the drafting of a “synthesis” report.

Remember, this is a 2-part Synod which will continue in October 2024.

WALKING TOGETHER

Last Monday Fr. Rich spoke to “Women of Faith,” a monthly faith enrichment program for women of our parish (which, by the way, has been meeting since 2008!). His topic was learning to walk together, which is a very Synodal theme.

He reflected a bit on the words like “Accompany” and “Companion,” both which have in their Latin roots the word “panis,” which means “bread.” Some of us remember the beautiful hymn about the Eucharist called *Panis Angelicus*, “food of the angels.” The Eucharist is indeed heavenly food, bread from heaven, and it is for *us*. Jesus gave us this greatest gift, His Body and Blood, to remember Him, and more: to participate in His life, as He participates in ours. Living in communion with Christ means learning to walk together as Jesus walked with so many.

Fr. Rich likened our walking together to a piano accompanist. He emphasized how walking together means making space for another, paying attention, listening without judgement and being flexible enough to follow another’s agenda and not our own. As disciples of Christ, we are also called to help each other grow and mature in our walk with Lord.

The goal of the Synod, he said, is to help us be this kind of Church, one that goes out and meets people where they are, helping them to discover God in their journey.

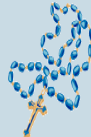

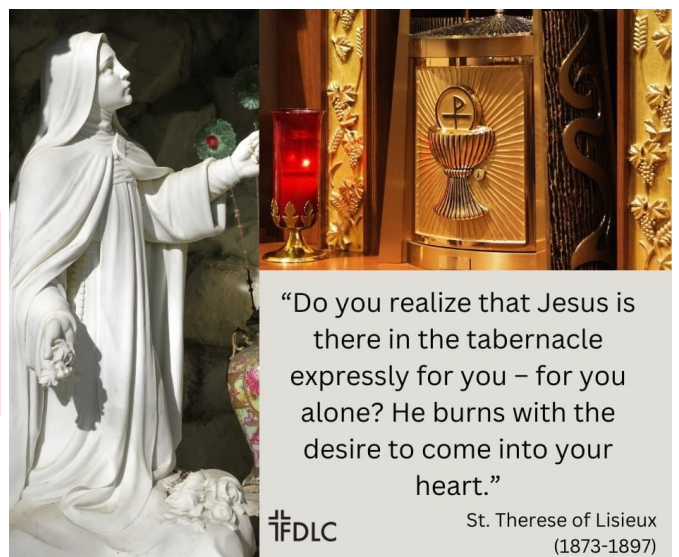

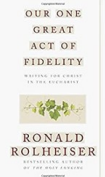
