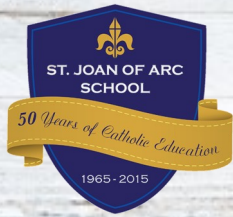

GOSPEL

Mt 23: 1-12

Jesus spoke to the crowds and to his disciples, saying, "The scribes and the Pharisees have taken their seat on the chair of Moses. Therefore, do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you, but do not follow their example. For they preach but they do not practice. They tie up heavy burdens hard to carry and lay them on people's shoulders, but they will not lift a finger to move them. All their works are performed to be seen. They widen their phylacteries and lengthen their tassels. They love places of honor at banquets, seats of honor in synagogues, greetings in marketplaces, and the salutation 'Rabbi.' As for you, do not be called 'Rabbi.' You have but one teacher, and you are all brothers. Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven. Do not be called 'Master'; you have but one master, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

31st SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME/2023 *The funeral and your future*

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

November begins in heaven. Or, at least it gets us looking toward it. Leading the way are the Feasts of All Saints and All Souls (which we celebrated last week).

Every Funeral Mass also gets us looking to heaven.

At a Funeral Mass, while we grieve the death of a loved one, we do two things. We give thanks for the life they lived here, however short or long, **and** we also give thanks for the new life our loved one will receive in the presence of God — standing in the "light of God's face," as we so often pray in our Eucharistic Prayer.

At a Funeral Mass, we do not just look back. Our deceased loved ones are not just a memory. They have a future!

At every Funeral Mass we gather around an altar-table which reminds us of the eternal feast our loved one enjoys in the company of saints and angels praising God in heaven.

The Funeral Mass includes all the symbols of our baptism — when we were given the pledge of eternal life, when we began our journey with the Church as a disciple of Christ. That journey with Christ continues after death! We bring our deceased loved one down the aisle of the church to the foot of the altar where he or she prayed and received the Body of Christ in the Eucharist. At the end of the Funeral Mass, we take our loved one up that aisle for the last time, giving her or him to God, asking the angels to take our loved one to the heavenly banquet table where we believe we will meet again, where "God will be all in all" (1 Corinthians 15:28).

For a variety of reasons, some Catholics are choosing not to have a Funeral Mass for their loved one. I urge those thinking this way to reconsider. Celebrating the Eucharist in the Funeral Mass will bring hope and peace and strength to those mourning, as we celebrate the power of God's love over death!

SYNOD UPDATE

Part One of the 16th Synod of Bishops concluded last Sunday, October 29th with a Mass at St. Peter's with



Pope Francis presiding. The delegates of the Synod Assembly have submitted to the Church at large (that's all of us!) a synthesis document entitled "A Synodal Church in Mission." This is not a "carved in stone" final document. Remember: the Synod continues next October (2024). As a summary of what was discussed this past October, the document will serve as a springboard to continue the process of discerning the Holy Spirit's direction for the Universal Church. The document contains many "considerations" and "proposals." No doubt there will be many interpretations in the press about what it all means. Although the Synthesis can be a bit technical at times (we are hoping a summary might be soon made available), it is worth reading it for yourself.
