Mt 25: 1-3

PREP WORK PAYS

Jesus told his disciples this parable:

"The kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five were wise. The foolish ones, when taking their lamps, brought no oil with them, but the wise brought flasks of oil with their lamps. Since the bridegroom was long delayed, they all became drowsy and fell asleep. At midnight, there was a cry, 'Behold, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!' Then all those virgins got up and trimmed their lamps. The foolish ones said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' But the wise ones replied, 'No, for there may not be enough for us and you. Go instead to the merchants and buy some for yourselves.' While they went off to buy it, the bridegroom came and those who were ready went into the wedding feast with him. Then the door was locked. Afterwards the other virgins came and said, 'Lord, Lord, open the door for us!' But he said in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, I do not know you.' Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour."

FAITH SHARING QUESTIONS

Jesus talks about what it means to be prepared to receive the Kingdom of Heaven.

Often times in our daily lives we get so busy that we forget about God, praying, reading scriptures, attending Mass. Jesus tells us that it is important to keep ourselves ready.

What would we do differently in our lives if we knew we only had six months to live?

The month of November is a time to celebrate the souls of our faithfully departed. As a parish community, we remember these loved ones in a special way.

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Jesus takes us to another wedding in this Sunday's Gospel. Nothing takes more preparation than a wedding!

Going to Mass on Sunday requires prep work, too.

It wasn't always that way. There was a time when getting up on Sunday and going to Church was something as ordinary and as expected as getting up on a Monday and going to work or going to school, depending on your age. It was also something everybody did. We might not have all been going to the same building, but everyone in the neighborhood went somewhere where you prayed to God together.

Okay, not so today. Times are different. I don't want to judge the times or bemoan them. It is what it is, as they say. The fact is, for many people nowadays going to church requires forethought and planning. Again, I don't want to judge that or bemoan it. In fact, I want to encourage it.

I am told by parents who are very busy that **it is possible** to include Sunday Mass in their weekend schedule. Making the extra effort to do so sends a critical message to children: coming to Mass, praying together, hearing God's Word and receiving the Eucharist is important. It's important for kids today and a value that will stay with them into adulthood.

Many people tell me they don't go to Mass simply because they have fallen out of the habit; or that Sunday is their one day to sleep in; or some even have told me they've gotten lazy about Church (their word, not mine ... no judging here). To them, I say: **prep work**. Think: exercising your soul, your spiritual side, is as important as exercising your body, as important as getting sleep, even as important as earning a living. Therefore, it requires as much planning.

It is possible to be disciplined, to make the choice to come to Church to receive here the one gift Jesus left us to remember Him by: the Eucharist.

People in 12-Step programs can teach us something here. Going to a meeting is not just a good idea, it is life-saving for them. They know that the program works, **if they work it**. Not just once in a while, not just when it is convenient, not just when they have the time. They have to make a decision to go. They will be better for it and, what's more, they can help someone else out just by being there.

What we do in Church on Sunday is life-saving, too. The more we do it, the more it forms us and helps us live more fully aware of the presence of God in our life — and when we are more fully aware of the presence of God, it changes everything. I mean everything: the good, the bad, the beautiful and the awful parts of life. Plus, our presence in Church can help others.

May if you find this letter helpful you can share it with someone who does not attend Mass. But, please, don't judge them. Just kindly invite. Like Jesus would.

Eucharist: Food for our Journey Together

Dorothy Day (1897-1980), Servant of God, co-founder of the Catholic Worker Movement, on the Eucharist:

“To me, the Mass ... is glorious,” wrote Dorothy, “and I feel that though we know we are but dust, at the same time we know too, and most surely through the Mass, that we are little less than angels, that indeed it is not I but Christ in me worshipping, and in Him I can do all things, though without Him I am nothing. I would not dare write or speak or try to follow the vocation God has given me, to work for the poor and for peace, if I did not have the constant reassurance of the Mass.”



In another place, she wrote: “I think daily Mass and Communion is essential. I don’t think I could continue to live without that. I think when people go to daily Mass and receive Communion daily they’re happier, they’re readier and more alive to what God wants of them.”



Dorothy wrote once of a friend who no longer went to Mass daily. The friend had been doing so for fourteen years, but no longer felt it necessary. Too much routine. Dorothy commented: “One could only point out that breathing was routine, and eating was routine, and many a time we had no appetite ... [However] We go eat of this fruit of the tree of life [the Eucharist] because Jesus told us to. *He took upon himself our humanity that we might share in his divinity. We are nourished by his flesh that we may grow to be other Christs. I believe this literally, just as I believe the child is nourished by the milk from his mother’s breast.*”

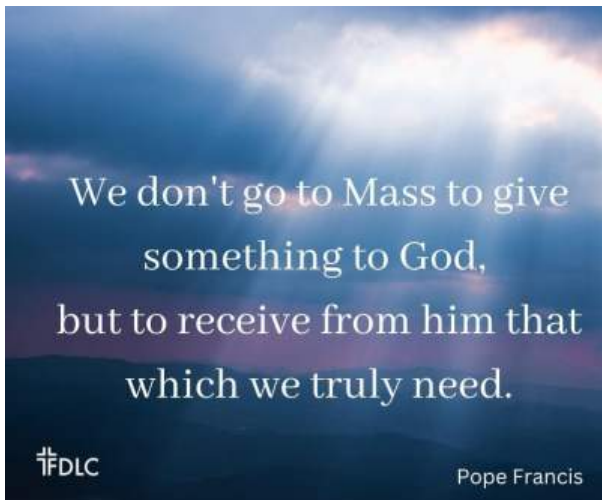

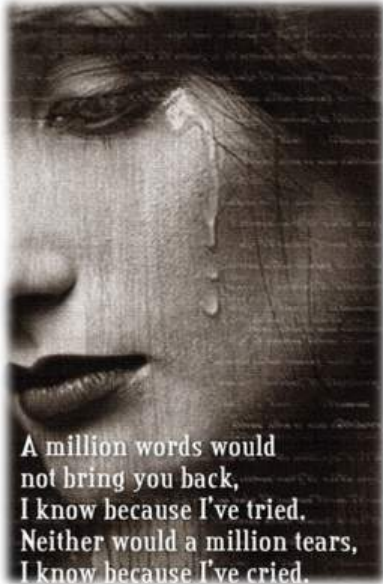

1. Capital Expenditures include: Partial repavement of the parking lot, new windows in the Religious Education Office, School bathroom hand dryers, and Convent HVAC pipe insulation.
2. The Church borrowed \$1,100,000 in February of 2012 for the Church refurbishing project. The loan balance at June 30, 2023 is approximately \$248,000.
3. Revenues in excess of Expenditures are transferred to the Operating and Capital Reserve Funds for future capital expenditures and operating needs, and for future loan repayment as necessary.

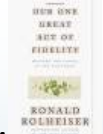
