GOSPEL

Mk 1: 1-8

The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God. As it is written in Isaiah the prophet: *Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way. A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths."* John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins. John was clothed in camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist. He fed on locusts and wild honey. And this is what he proclaimed: "One mightier than I is coming after me. I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

TIDINGS OF COMFORT

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

There's a lot going on in Chapter 40 of the Prophet Isaiah. Israel has just been conquered and exiled, stripped of their homeland. In the midst of this devastation, God tells the Prophet: "Comfort! Give comfort to my people! Speak tenderly to them." Though God knows the people have turned their back on Him (the cause of their collapse!), God still wants to comfort them.

This is the God I experience during our Funeral Masses here. The God who wants to tenderly comfort people who's hearts are broken. Losing a loved one is like losing a home.

But hold on. Something else happens in Isaiah 40 and in Funerals. God wants to move His people to a new place. Yes, even in the midst of grief, isolation, fear, loss, God wants to make something new of His people.

In Isaiah 40, God tells them to forge a new path ... right through the desert. Furthermore, God invites them to climb a mountain and proclaim to all the good news!

How can this be? How could God ask such a thing at such a time?

Perhaps God sees something in us we cannot see in ourselves when we are hurting.

Can we open ourselves to the grace of God during our most vulnerable time? Open ourselves to the possibility of something new, perhaps even something deeper, richer, life and love as we have not experienced life and love before.

We have models to look to. Like John the Baptist. Look to Mary of Nazareth, too. As God was asking of the people in Isaiah 40, they were mold-able. Open. Trusting. They met the Divine in a way never expected. It changed their life and even our world. Do you believe God can still be encountered like this today?

Let's Advent Together!

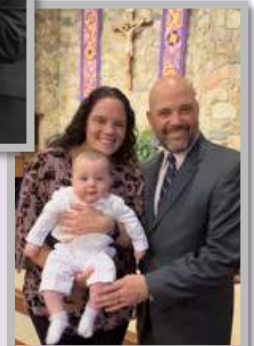

Let's do Advent together! We hope this Advent Calendar will help all of us prepare together for Christmas and the coming of the Lord! (Pay Attention: the dates are purposely scrambled to keep us on our toes ... the way Advent wants to prepare us, up on our toes, alert, awake and ready to meet Jesus!

SUNDAY, DECEMBER 10

Try not to think of Sunday Mass as "Me and God" time. Sunday Mass is about "Us and God." It is the most communal form of prayer we have as Roman Catholic Christians. We come on Sunday to give praise and thanks to God **with** this community gathered here and with the communion of saints in heaven. Try really hard to meet someone new at every Sunday Mass. Introduce yourself to the persons you crawl over to get into the pew, or to the people who crawl over you. Consider it your responsibility (as in: your *job*) to help everyone gathered for Mass to worship God reverently and joyfully, to listen attentively to the Word of God, to grow in our awareness of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.



WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 13

FEAST OF ST. LUCY

A trip to the freezer today might inspire us to ask what in our life (in our personality, or relationships) needs to be defrosted. A trip to the stove can inspire us to bring to prayer what we find in our life needing to have a flame put beneath it, or stirred up a bit. Ask St. Lucy to help you see both, what needs defrosting and what needs a little fire. Her name means light and she is the patron of the blind.

TUESDAY, DECEMBER 12

FEAST OF OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

Today's Feast takes us to Mexico "where on this day in 1531, just outside of Mexico City, the Mother of God appeared to a 57 year old, recently baptized Aztec peasant named Juan Diego. The Virgin Mary was dressed as an Aztec woman, with child. She filled Diego's poncho with roses and told him to go and show them to the local bishop. When Diego released the roses and presented them to the bishop, imprinted upon his poncho was the now infamous image of our Lady of Guadalupe."

SATURDAY, DECEMBER 16

It's **"Get Out the Creche Day!"** If you haven't already, today is a good day to set up the Nativity scene in your house ... and if you don't have one, today is a good day to go get one!

The beautiful tradition of setting up a Nativity scene began 800 years ago!

The first nativity scene was created by Saint Francis of Assisi in a small grotto near an Italian village called Greccio. He went to that grotto on Christmas in the year 1223, **800 years ago this year**, in order to contemplate with his own eyes the mystery that amazed him: the Incarnation of the immensity of heaven and earth in a fragile creature, in a child.

Thomas of Celano, the first biographer of St. Francis, writes: "The manger is prepared, the hay is carried in, and the ox and the ass are led to the spot. There simplicity is given a place of honor, poverty is exalted, humility is commended, and **out of Greccio is made a new Bethlehem.** The night is lit up like the day."

"This is how our tradition began: with everyone gathered in joy around the cave with no distance between the original event and those sharing in it's mystery." (Pope Francis)

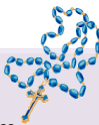

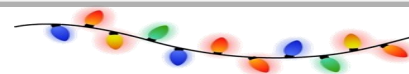
