GOSPEL Jn 1: 6-8, 19-28

A man named John was sent from God. He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to testify to the light.

And this is the testimony of John. When the Jews from Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to him to ask him, "Who are you?" He admitted and did not deny it, but admitted, "I am not the Christ." So they asked him, "What are you then? Are you Elijah?" And he said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." So they said to him, "Who are you, so we can give an answer to those who sent us? What do you have to say for yourself?" He said: "I am the voice of one crying out in the desert, 'make straight the way of the Lord," as Isaiah the prophet said." Some Pharisees were also sent. They asked him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Christ or Elijah or the Prophet?" John answered them, "I baptize with water; but there is one among you whom you do not recognize, the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie." Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Here we are in the Third Week of Advent. We've reached the pink candle on the Advent Wreath. The Sunday we name Gaudete, Latin for "REJOICE."

I urge everyone to make the best of this 3rd week of preparation because this year there will not be a 4th week. So, prepare the house, meals, gifts, cards, and also your heart, for the celebration of the Birth of Christ!

Although there is no 4th week of Advent, there WILL BE a Fourth Sunday of Advent (there always is!)! So, please don't skip it! Come next Sunday (or, if you prefer, Saturday evening, we are adding a 4pm Mass to make it easier).

As always, for Christmas, expect crowds. Come ready to joyfully greet people, especially the folks you do not know. Meet the folks sitting around you. We want people to say, "St. Joan of Arc is the friendliest parish ever!"

Leave big heavy coats in the car. Come ready to squeeze in. Don't worry about getting "your pew." Please don't "save seats;" it just causes everyone anxiety and raises people's blood pressure (not in a good way!)

Sing! Sing your heart out at Christmas Mass. You will know the songs, trust me! Singing is praying twice. Plus, when you sing, it sets a great example for all those around you.

After Mass, clean up around you (tissues, water bottles, Cheerios, mittens, etc). Even if it's not your stuff, clean it up for the folks coming to the next Mass.

Be kind and gentle in the parking lot! Remember: Jesus wasn't born inside a building; He was born outside in the parking lot, so to speak. Make it holy ground! Treat all other vehicles as if there is a Baby Jesus on board!



ADVENTING ...

Let's do Advent together! We hope this Advent Calendar will help all of us prepare together for Christmas and the coming of the Lord! (Pay Attention: the dates are purposely scrambled to keep us on our toes ... the way Advent wants to prepare us, up on our toes, alert, awake and ready to meet Jesus!

SUNDAY, DECEMBER 17

It's the Sunday with the pink candle. The third candle. The third Sunday of Advent. We call it "Gaudete Sunday." Gaudete means "Rejoice."

I don't think this is where we get the expression, "tickled pink," but you never know. Rejoicing certainly changes the look of one's face.

St. Paul tells the Thessalonians not simply to rejoice, but to rejoice always!" He says it quite emphatically, as if commanding it. Perhaps St. Paul understands that sometimes, given the state of the world, or situations in our own individual lives, it is difficult to rejoice and give thanks (giving thanks just seems to go with rejoicing, right?)

So, today, this week, REJOICE! Even if you don't feel like it. Imagine how it might lift your soul ... and change the color of your face!

TUESDAY, DECEMBER 19:

Elizabeth is said to be "barren" (Luke 1:5-25). In Biblical terms, it means she had no children. Such a harsh word! But God chooses her, Elizabeth, an elderly woman, childless, to give birth to John (the Baptizer). It turns out "barren" is *our* word, not God's! God sees no one as infertile or sterile. God sees all as full of potential, full of life, full of grace! We will see this again as Mary, a virgin, gives birth to Jesus, the Christ, the Savior of the world!

Pray for those who feel unfulfilled, or feel a failure, for those who feel they have nothing to give. Pray they see themselves as God sees them.

God never gives up on us!

"My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my savior, for he has looked upon his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is his Name. He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation. He has shown the strength of his arm, and has scattered the proud in their conceit. He has cast down the mighty from their thrones and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty. He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he remembered his promise of mercy, the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children for ever." (Luke 1:46-56)

Hark!

Hark! While related to "behold" it means more "to listen." Listen to angels singing. Or, as in Song of Songs (2:8-14), listen for your lover, bounding over the hills, calling to you!

Hark! Listen! It would be good with all the hustle and bustle of final preparations to take each day to harken, to listen to your heartbeat (or to another's), to listen to the lights twinkling on the Christmas tree or in the night sky, to listen to silence.

Hark! God speaks in so many ways, so many of them so softly.

FAITH SHARING QUESTIONS

John the Baptist is sure about his own identity because he is sure about the identity of Jesus. John was believed by those who heard him because he helped them recognize Jesus in their midst. In your family life, what specific ways do you lead one another to recognize Jesus' presence in our world?

What was John the Baptist's reply when asked, "Who are you?" John said that he was not the Messiah or Elijah or the Prophet. But then John quoted the prophet Isaiah, saying that he was "the voice of one crying out in the desert, make straight the way of the Lord."

What does your voice sound like to others? Is it judgmental or gentle; angry or kind; snippy or patient? John cries out with conviction and courage about who Jesus is. What brings you to cry out in life? What brings you to cry out with conviction about who Jesus is in your life? What are the "deserts" in your life and how can they lead to life and light?

Since this third Sunday of Advent is known as "Gaudete Sunday" (Gaudete means "rejoice"), what was a joyful moment for you this week and did you recognize God within your joy?






