GOSPEL Jn 3: 14-21

Jesus said to Nicodemus: "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life."

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed. But whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.

4th Sunday IN LENT /2024 **D.I.Y. or LENT?**

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

"Many younger Christians are rethinking or reclaiming Lent." That is the subtitle of a recent article that caught my attention for obvious reasons. According to the author there has been a spike in "organized religion's" tradition of sacrificing in preparation for the Easter celebration. No evidence was provided on how big the spike is, but even if it is a tiny blip, I'll take it!

One reason cited for the return to tradition: rules! "There is a paradox of feeling freer during a rule-bound Lenten season: the rules rescue you from the pressure to pretend you are a totally autonomous being." As Tiffany Reed, a freelance writer in Waco, Texas, said: "We live in a culture where you can have every comfort and an extremely high level of self-determination relative to history. You can do what you want with your time and money. In that context, taking on Lent is a powerful reminder that you're a finite, weak creature who has to eat multiple times a day to stay alive. The true nature of our presence in this world is extreme dependence."

This harkens to Lent's reminder: "we are dust" to Lent's challenge to repent of our sins, to turn away from our self-centeredness and turn to God.

We need God. We need each other. Lent, Church, gives us both. Is this not an answer to the rising sense of loneliness among many people and not just the young? For too long we have tried D.I.Y. It doesn't work.

D.I.Y. means "do-it-yourself." That's a lot of pressure. We don't have to D.I.Y. In the Church we have a long history of women and men (we name them Saints) who have followed Christ and passed on a great amount of wisdom to us. Included in that wisdom is Lent's long tradition of self-sacrifice and self-denial. Whether it is letting go of social media or abstaining from meat on Fridays or even fasting from worrying too much, the important thing is to let go of the false idols that can dominate our lives and entrap us. Lent wants to change the direction of our human "impulse to worship." And so "the aim of the hunger pains is to drive home your dependence of God." Our tradition, Lent, gives us a structure for this.

So does the Eucharist.

Good Lent!

4th Sunday of Lent's Eucharistic Word: Mercy

In the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

1397 The Eucharist commits us to the poor. To receive in truth the Body and Blood of Christ given up for us, we must recognize Christ in the poorest, his brothers and sisters:

"You have tasted the Blood of the Lord, vet you do not recognize your brother,.... You dishonor this table when you do not judge worthy of sharing your food someone judged worthy to take part in this meal.... God freed you from all your sins and invited you here, but you have not become more merciful." (St. John Chrysostom)

Jesus is the face of God's mercy.

Every Mass we say the word "mercy," usually in English, but sometimes, as in Lent, in Greek.

Kyrie eleison. (Lord have mercy) Christe eleison. (Christ have mercy)

The Miracle of the Loaves and Fishes

It was an incredible miracle! The feeding of more than five thousand people with a few loaves of bread and a couple of fish is astounding and certainly worth telling about. All four Gospels record it. But let's not let the "amazingness" of it overshadow the spark that lit the fire of this miracle.

This incredible miracle began with Jesus moved with compassion for the crowd of people who had been with him for several days, who were far from home, who were hungry.

Jesus feeds us today because He sees we are hungry and thirsty for real food and for realness, for meaningfulness and purpose. He feeds us because He sees we are strangers, separated, from God, from each other, from ourselves. He feeds us because He sees we are naked and afraid and vulnerable; because we are ill and ailing and diseased and hurting. He feeds us today because He sees before Him a people imprisoned, trapped, lonely, lost, longing to be free.

Christ gives us the Eucharist for the same reason He gave His life on the cross ... because He loves us and He knows His love is something we cannot live without.

Today's Gospel and the Eucharist [John 3:14-21]

Sometimes the image of God wagging his finger in condemnation is an appealing image ... just so long as you are not the one getting condemned.

We want people who do wrong to be punished. So does God. But God also wants more than that. God wants healing, conversion, reconciliation. These things can only come from mercy.

Why did God send Jesus into the world? Emphatically not to condemn it. Listen to John's Gospel, 3:17: "For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved." This follows one of the most familiar passages in all the Gospels: "For God so loved the world that He sent His only Son so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but have eternal life" (3:16).

When Christ feeds us with His body and blood in the Eucharist at Mass, He nourishes us not for the work of condemnation and judgement, but to be ministers of reconciliation, proclaimers of the Good News of God's love and mercy.

How has the Eucharist made you a more merciful person? How has it made you more patient, more understanding?

How has the Eucharist deepened your love for others?

How has the Eucharist moved you to serve and care for those who are hurting?

The Medicine of Mercy

Early in his papacy, our Holy Father, Pope Francis, said, "The thing the church needs most today is the ability to heal wounds and to warm the hearts of the faithful; it needs nearness, proximity. I see the Church as a field hospital after battle. It is useless to ask a seriously injured person if he has high cholesterol and about the level of his blood sugars! You have to heal his wounds. Then we can talk about everything else. Heal the wounds, heal the wounds."

It is a powerful image. Not isolated behind protective walls, the Church is meant to go out to where people are hurting and suffering, to extend God's care and compassion, to be a sign of the presence of the healing, merciful Christ.

When convening the Second Vatican Council back in 1962, Pope John XXIII used a similar image when he said the Church, the spouse of Christ, "prefers to make use of the medicine of mercy rather than of severity. She considers that she meets the needs of the present day by demonstrating the validity of her teaching rather than by condemnations."

We are part of this Church, this body of Christ. How do we make use of the medicine of mercy in our daily lives with family and friends, classmates and coworkers?

What wounds do you see needing to be healed today? In your family? In your local community ... parish ... country ... world?
