GOSPEL

Jn 2: 13-25

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, Zeal for your house will consume me. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken. While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well. For this weekend's readings, click here.

How do you feel knowing that Jesus absolutely dwells within YOU as a temple of God? In what way is God speaking to your heart this week about your Lenten journey thus far?



In the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

1379 The **tabernacle** was first intended for the reservation of the Eucharist in a worthy place so that it could be brought to the sick and those absent outside of Mass. As faith in the real presence of Christ in his Eucharist deepened, the Church became conscious of the meaning of silent adoration of the Lord present under the Eucharistic species. It is for this reason that the tabernacle should be located in an especially worthy place in the church and should be constructed in such a way that it emphasizes and manifests the truth of the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.

1380 It is highly fitting that Christ should have wanted to remain present to his Church in this unique way. Since Christ was about to take his departure from his own in his visible form, he wanted to give us his sacramental presence; since he was about to offer himself on the cross to save us, he wanted us to have the memorial of the love with which he loved us "to the end," even to the giving of his life. In his Eucharistic presence he remains mysteriously in our midst as the one who loved us and gave himself up for us, and he remains under signs that express and communicate this love. The Church and the world have a great need for Eucharistic worship. Jesus awaits us in this sacrament of love. Let us not refuse the time to go to meet him in adoration, in contemplation full of faith, and open to making amends for the offenses and crimes of the world. Let our adoration never cease.

3rd Sunday of Lent's Eucharistic Word: Tabernacle

"Tabernacle" means "dwelling place" and has its origins in the Latin word for "tent." The tabernacle in every Catholic Church is the dwelling place for the Blessed Sacrament, the Eucharist. Every Catholic Church has a tabernacle and near it a candle called the "tabernacle lamp." The light of this candle reminds all who enter that this building is more than a building. This space is sacred because the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist is housed in the Tabernacle.

In most parish churches, like ours, the Tabernacle can be found somewhere in the sanctuary, the area of the church with the altar and ambo (pulpit). In many larger churches, cathedrals and basilicas, the Tabernacle is kept in a separate chapel near the sanctuary (i.e. St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City and the

Basilica Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C.)

You are most welcome to come to St. Joan of Arc Church during the week to pray in the presence of Christ Jesus and to adore Christ present in the Blessed Sacrament in the Tabernacle.



Today's Gospel and the Eucharist (John 2:13-25)

Maybe it is strange for you to hear Jesus refer to himself as a temple. You are not alone. It caught a lot of people off guard back when Jesus walked the earth. We hear of one such time in today's Gospel passage from John.

The temple in Jerusalem was a place of worship, prayer and also sacrifice. Now Jesus identifies this holy place with His body.

Where Christ dwells or lives is an important question throughout John's Gospel. The first question put to Jesus in John's Gospel (1:28) is, "Where are you staying?" In other words, where do you dwell, abide?

Later, Jesus discusses with the Samaritan woman (Jn 4:19-24) where true worship occurs. The woman tells him her "ancestors worshipped on this mountain." Jesus tells the day will come, and indeed is already here, "when true worshippers will worship the Father in Spirit and truth." Worshiping God is not a question of geography. It is a matter of relationship.

In Matthew' (27:51), when Jesus dies on the cross, the curtain of the Temple, which separates the people from the Holy of Holies, is torn in two. Before, only the High Priest could enter, but now Christ, the eternal High Priest establishes the New Covenant in His blood. Now, in the words of St. Paul, nothing can "separate us from the love of God which comes to us through Christ Jesus" (Romans 8:39).

Therefore, in Christ we all have access to God. In the Eucharist, bread from heaven, Christ dwells within us. Our bodies, then, are temples of the Holy Spirit!

SHOWING REVERENCE

Because Christ is truly present in the Eucharist, it is proper to show a deep reverence for the Blessed Sacrament housed in the Tabernacle. To show this reverence, it is customary to genuflect (kneel on one knee) or bow, when entering your pew, as well as when approaching or passing by the Tabernacle. Once Mass begins, without being disrespectful, our attention is given to the Ambo where Christ speaks to us in the Word of God. to the Altar where bread and wine are consecrated, and even to the people and priest, where we also believe Christ is present.

"The Virgin Mary is the mother of God. In her womb, for the first time in history, God becomes human. She carries him quietly and powerfully. She is a living tabernacle. Mary reminds us that we, too, carry Christ within us after receiving Communion, as living tabernacles."

Did You Know?

Tabernacle, NJ, was originally known as "Tabernacle In The Wilderness" due in fact to the establishment of a log church by a missionary named John Brainerd. In the 1980s, the Diocese of Trenton established a Catholic parish in Tabernacle called, most appropriately, **Holy Eucharist**.




