GOSPEL John 20:19-31

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord.

Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe."

Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!"

Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

POPE FRANCIS ***Servant to the Servant of God***

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

When he stood on the balcony at St. Peter's Square on that day in March of 2013, the newly elected Pope, the first from the Americas, took the name of Francis. At first, many of us wondered, since he was also the first Jesuit elected to the papacy, if the name he chose was in honor of Francis Xavier, also a Jesuit. But, no. We were to learn soon enough. It was Francis of Assisi.

The name a Pope chooses says much. In this case, our Pope Francis lived up to the example of Francis of Assisi. Mercy, service, humility and care for the poor were themes in the saint's life; these too were the themes of our Francis, our Holy Father, these past twelve years.

I will remember many things Pope Francis did and said. Three things stand out. First: he said the name of God is Mercy. Second: he said those who serve as leaders in the Church should "smell like the sheep." Third: He said the Eucharist isn't meant to be a reward for living a good life; but a help for disciples to love like Christ. And, a fourth, now that I think about it: he said the Church should be like a field hospital, helping the wounded and hurting.

Pope Francis challenged all of us to be merciful, humble servants of the Lord Jesus.

I, of course, never met him. I never spoke to him. Never even got very close to him (saw him from afar in Philadelphia). But I will miss him. I will miss him very much. Rest in peace, good and faithful servant!

EASTER THANKS

ADULT FAITH FORMATION

Pope Francis' death is a great loss to our church and the world. He will forever be honored and remembered for his commitment to lifting up the most vulnerable, to serving and accompanying all people of God and for his humility.

In his infinite knowledge and wisdom, Pope Francis' humility resonates as is evident in his burial requests....he chose a modest wooden coffin which will not be elevated; instead, it will face the pews. He will wear simple red investments while holding rosaries in his hands. He will not be buried in the Vatican with pomp and circumstance; instead he asked to be buried in the intimate church of Santa Maria Maggiore, which is the oldest church in the western world dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, near and dear to his favorite icon of the Madonna. His tomb will simply say one word, Franciscus.

HOW A NEW POPE IS CHOSEN: Typically, 15-20 days after the pope's death, the College of Cardinals, appointed by the pope, gather from around the world in Rome for a conclave. The word conclave comes from the Latin *cum clave*, meaning "with key" (a lockable room) indicating the closed process of electing a pope.

The conclave begins with a celebration of Mass at Saint Peter's Basilica asking the Holy Spirit for guidance in electing a new pope. After Mass, a series of meetings begin, general congregations, to discuss the needs and challenges of the global Catholic Church and what qualities are desired in the next successor to Saint Peter. The conclave officially begins when the cardinals process to the Sistine Chapel, under Michelangelo's magnificent painted ceiling. The Sistine chapel is transformed into a secure venue to allow for secret deliberations.

Only cardinals under the age of 80, cardinal electors, are eligible to vote in a conclave. Currently, there are 250+ cardinals but only about 135 are cardinal electors. After the words, *extra omnes*, meaning "everyone out", are spoken, everyone must exit the chapel with the exception of the voting cardinals. All cardinals swear an oath of absolute secrecy before the doors are sealed. Cardinals are not permitted to communicate with the outside world and strict rules are in place to ensure secrecy during the election process. Cell phones, newspapers, television, letters, or messages are not allowed.

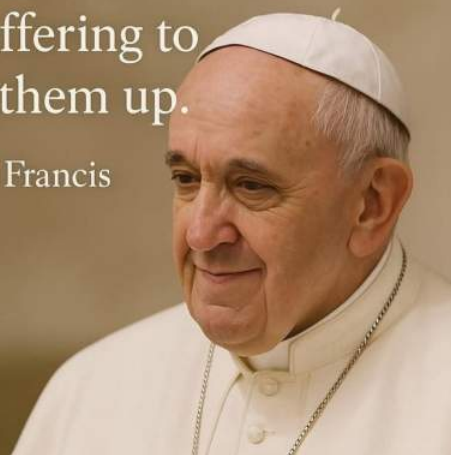
The voting begins. Each cardinal is given a ballot card with the words, *eligo in summum pontificem* printed at the top, meaning "I elect as the supreme pontiff" and is expected to write a chosen cardinal's name on the card. Since the ballot is secret, the cardinals process one by one up to Michelangelo's fresco of the Last Judgment, praying and placing the twice-folded ballot into a large chalice. Four rounds of balloting are taken every day until a candidate receives 2/3 of the vote. The result of each ballot are counted aloud and recorded by three designated cardinals. Prior to the conclave, a chimney is installed atop the roof of the Sistine Chapel and if no one receives the necessary 2/3 of the vote, the ballots are burned in a stove near the chapel with a mixture of chemicals to produce black smoke.

When a cardinal receives the necessary 2/3 vote, the dean of the College of Cardinals asks if he accepts his election. If the cardinal accepts, he chooses a papal name, is dressed in papal investments and processes out to the balcony of Saint Peter's Basilica. The ballots of the final round are burned with chemicals producing white smoke to signal to the world the election of a new pope. The senior cardinal deacon announces from the balcony of Saint Peter's, "Habemus Papam" — "We have a pope" — before the new pope processes out and blesses the city of Rome and the world.

During the coming weeks, let us pray collectively as a global church for the College of Cardinals to hear the voice of God's Holy Spirit in their hearts during the decision-making process. May we remember Pope Francis as a shepherd who truly knew how to not only live the Gospel but also how to articulate it.
