GOSPEL John 21:1-14

At that time, Jesus revealed himself to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself in this way. Together were Simon Peter, Thomas called Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two others of his disciples.

Simon Peter said to them, ""I am going fishing.""

They said to him, ""We also will come with you.""

So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus.

Jesus said to them, ""Children, have you caught anything to eat?""

They answered him, ""No.""

So he said to them, ""Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something.""

So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish.

So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, ""It is the Lord.""

When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish. When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread.

Jesus said to them, ""Bring some of the fish you just caught.""

So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn.

Jesus said to them, ""Come, have breakfast.""

And none of the disciples dared to ask him, ""Who are you?"" because they realized it was the Lord.

Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish. This was now the third time Jesus was revealed to his disciples after being raised from the dead.

PETER AND US

May 4, 2025

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

As we await the start of the Conclave, during which a new Pope will be elected, no doubt you have heard the Pope referred to as "the successor of St. Peter." And so he is. We trace the ministry of the Pope, who is also the Bishop of Rome, all the way back to St. Peter who was martyred in the city of Rome in the AD 60s. The current basilica name in Vatican City, sits on the place of Peter's death and burial.

Although Jesus never used the word "pope," it is very clear in the Gospels that Peter, if not the leader of the Twelve, was the most prominent among them, often their spokesperson. We see evidence of this in today's first reading in the Acts of the Apostles, in the phrase "Peter and the apostles." We see it in the last chapter of John's Gospel as Jesus, after His resurrection, three times commissions Peter to "feed his sheep."

266 successors of St. Peter have held the Petrine Office. The latest, of course, Pope Francis. But in a very real way, although there is only one Pontiff of the Catholic Church, we are all successors of St. Peter and the first Apostles and disciples of Christ. It was because of their preaching and witness, their commitment to Christ, their unwavering faith and hope and their love for one another, that the early Church began to quickly grow throughout the Mediterranean world. We stand on their shoulders.

As we follow the proceedings of the Conclave, reflect on how you are a part of this long and living faith Tradition. Reflect on the women and men who shared faith in Jesus with you, the women and men who embodied Christ's message for you. And, most importantly, reflect on how you pass this faith on to the next generation. It is only through you, through each of us, that children and grandchildren will come to know Jesus Christ.

"Pontiff," a title for the Pope, is Latin for bridge (think of pontoon). We all must be a bridge to younger generations. We must connect to young people who need faith, a relationship with Christ. We must help young people connect to Christ. How is it possible to handle the complexities of the modern world without knowing Jesus? Just as Jesus commissioned Peter, so he sends us. We must feed young people with the values that will help them find meaning and hope and purpose and lasting joy. We must help them know the love and mercy of God. We must help them discover the presence of God and live for His Kingdom, preparing for the eternal Kingdom to come.

All of this comes with knowing Jesus Christ.
