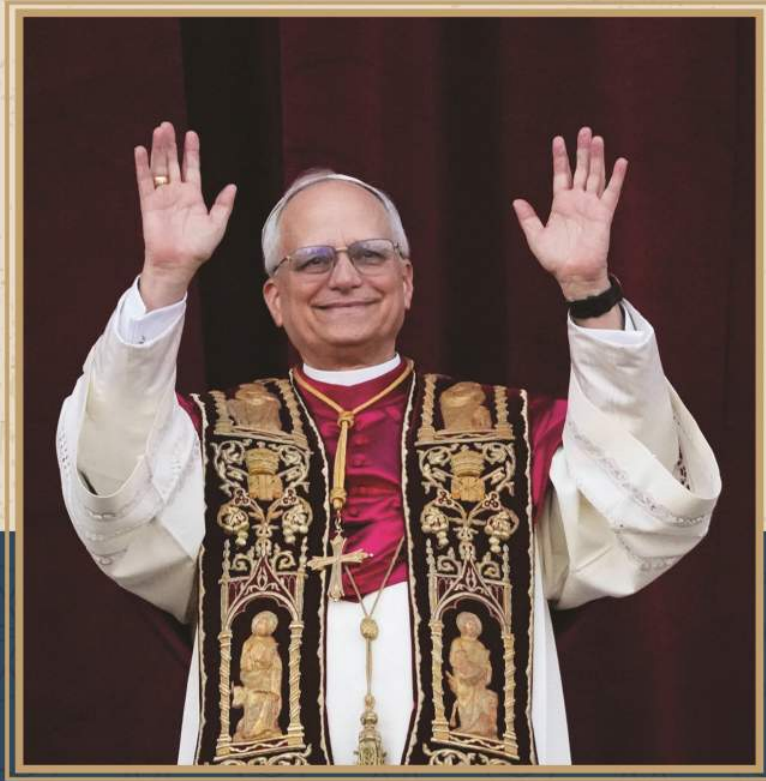

POPE LEO XIV

WE HAVE A POPE!

May 18, 2025

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Theologians and holy people all say it does not matter what nation from which the Pope comes. I totally agree. But isn't it *just great* that our new Pope Leo XIV is American! Incredible. Did you ever think you'd live to see it? (I certainly didn't.) And how lucky are we that there is even a local connection with Pope Leo who is a Villanova alumnus! I am hearing of people in our parish who went to Villanova with him and even knew him!

The news is over a week old as you read this, but I am writing this only hours after the white smoke and announcement of our newest Pontiff. Remember, "pontiff" comes from a Latin word meaning "bridge." Pope Leo XIV used the word "bridge" in his opening talk on the balcony. (I am including a transcript of the Pope's talk in this bulletin.

Jesus Christ is our ultimate bridge to the Father, to God's love and mercy, to eternal life. The Pope is the Church's bridge, uniting all of us. We are called to be a bridge of love and hope and reconciliation to one another. As we begin this new chapter in our lives as disciples of Christ, let's recommit ourselves to being bridges of unity in our speech, our posting, our actions.

May God bless and protect Pope Leo XIV as he guides and inspires and challenges us to live the Gospel of Jesus Christ!

OPENING WORDS OF POPE LEO XIV

May 8, 2025

Peace be with you! Dearest brothers and sisters, this was the first greeting of the risen Christ, the good shepherd who gave his life for the flock of God. I, too, would like this greeting of peace to enter your hearts, to reach your families and all people, wherever they are; and all the peoples, and all the earth: Peace be with you.

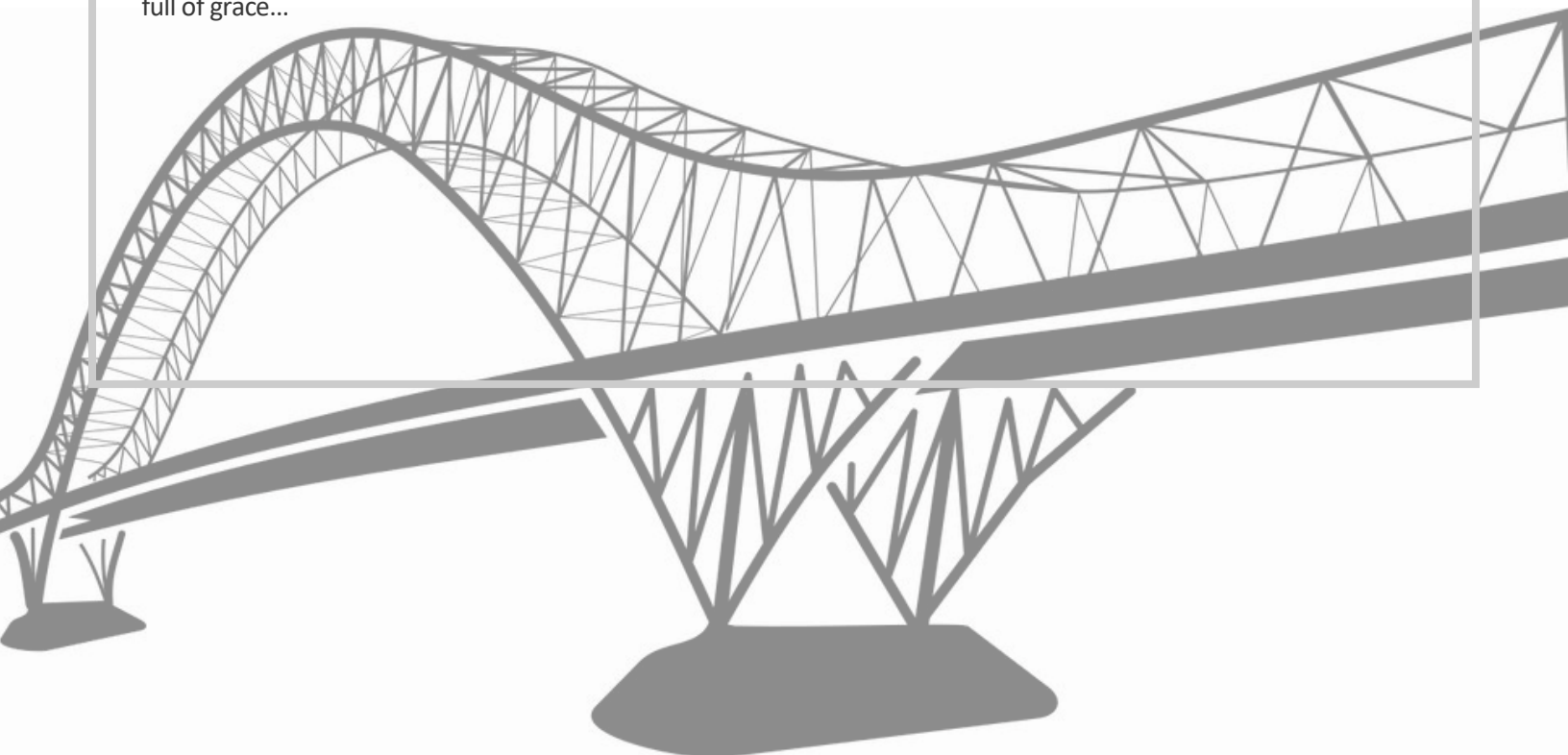
This is the peace of the risen Christ, a disarming and humble and preserving peace. It comes from God. God, who loves all of us, without any limits or conditions. Let us keep in our ears the weak but always brave voice of Pope Francis, who blessed Rome — the Pope who blessed Rome and the world that day on the morning of Easter. Allow me to continue that same blessing. God loves us, all of us, evil will not prevail. We are all in the hands of God. Without fear, united, hand in hand with God and among ourselves, we will go forward. We are disciples of Christ, Christ goes before us, and the world needs his light. Humanity needs him like a bridge to reach God and his love. You help us to build bridges with dialogue and encounter so we can all be one people always in peace. Thank you, Pope Francis!

Thank you to my Cardinal brothers who chose me to be the successor of Peter and to walk together with you as a united church searching all together for peace and justice, working together as women and men, faithful to Jesus Christ without fear, proclaiming Christ, to be missionaries, faithful to the Gospel. I am a son of Saint Augustine, an Augustinian. He said, “With you I am a Christian, for you a bishop.” So may we all walk together toward that homeland that God has prepared for us.

To the church of Rome, a special greeting: We have to look together how to be a missionary church, building bridges, dialogue, always open to receiving with open arms for everyone, like this square, open to all, to all who need our charity, our presence, dialogue, love. And if you allow me also, a word, a greeting to all those and in a particular way to my dear diocese of Chiclayo, in Peru, where a faithful people has accompanied its bishop, has shared its faith and has given so much, so much to continue being a faithful church of Jesus Christ.

To all you brothers and sisters of Rome, Italy, of all the world, we want to be a synodal church, walking and always seeking peace, charity, closeness, especially to those who are suffering.

Today is the day of the Supplication to Our Lady of Pompeii. Our blessed Mother Mary always wants to walk with us, be close to us, she always wants to help us with her intercession and her love. So let us pray together for this mission, and for all of the church and for peace in the world. We ask for this special grace from Mary, our mother. Hail Mary, full of grace...

Tai Chi uses slow, gentle movements to help the body utilize large amounts of oxygen. The exercise aids in digestion, enhances circulation, and reduces blood pressure. While the body is revitalizing through oxygenation and cleansing breath, the mind is free to focus on internal cleansing. It is especially beneficial for seniors and it can be practiced standing, sitting, or laying down making it accessible to everyone.

Pope Francis' Creation Care Legacy (Part 1)

Pope Francis will be remembered for making all things that live on the earth a pastoral priority. He helped the world to see caring for creation not as a political, social, scientific or ideological battle, but as a moral imperative. This is because the poor and future generations will suffer most from environmental degradation. He taught that abusing the "common home" of the earth, its ecosystems and all forms of life that depend on it "...is a grave sin."

Francis spoke of the growing environmental crises as signaling broader broken relationships between man and God, man and fellow man, and man and nature. Social, economic, political and environmental issues are not separate problems, but are dimensions of one overarching crisis, according to Francis. In his landmark encyclical *Laudato Si': On Care for our Common Home*, Francis spoke of an "integral ecology" and demonstrated that everything is interconnected. To address the environmental crisis, Francis taught that we need to fix our relationship with God, our fellow humans, and be open to an "ecological conversion." As part of his legacy, Pope Francis solidly established ecology and stewardship of creation as a pro-life, pro-marginalized, and pro-family issue.

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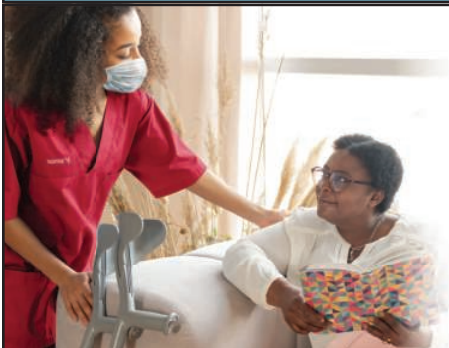
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
