GOSPEL

Matthew 24:37-44

Jesus said to his disciples: "As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. In those days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day that Noah entered the ark. They did not know until the flood came and carried them all away. So will it be also at the coming of the Son of Man. Two men will be out in the field; one will be taken, and one will be left. Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken, and one will be left. Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour of night when the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and not let his house be broken into. So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

The Rite of Acceptance

This step involves a liturgical rite: the Rite of Acceptance (for the unbaptized) and the Rite of Welcoming (for the baptized). HERE TO THERE

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

We are in the age of process. In this modern era, we've learned so much about stages of life, stages of grief, stages of faith. We've learned that learning is a process. Aging is a process. And we hate it. Process, we hate it. We either try to speed through it or in the case of aging, deny it altogether.

In these highly techno times, it is harder and harder for us to let things develop, germinate, unfold, grow. We want things to happen when we want them to happen and it's usually at the speed of lightening.

But Advent — four weeks of preparation for Christmas, four weeks the non-Church world completely ignores, four weeks many Church-people also ignore — is all about process. Notice: one candle gets lit at a time, not all four. Advent wants to nurture growth, curiosity, wonder, imagination, anticipation.

Christmas is already happening everywhere except in here. In church. We are waiting for it because we believe there is a value in the preparation, in the journey, in taking time to wake up and grow in awareness of the presence of God, to grow in awareness of the kind of life God is calling us to live and the kind of world God is calling us to build.

Advent wants to move us along, to grow our heart, to widen our eyes, to extend our reach, to broaden our shoulders, to deepen our breath. Advent wants to move us from one place to another ... always deeper and deeper into the mystery of Christ.

Does all of this sound too philosophical? Then try this: Advent wants to move us from GLOOM TO GLOW. That's how one of the members of our Liturgy Planning Team described it at our last meeting. It's a good description because Advent is every bit as much a season of light as Christmas. There is a process involved in walking through darkness, seeing light, welcoming light, embracing light, becoming light.

This Advent, consider where you are. Consider where God wants to lead you. Consider where God wants to lead the world. Consider how you will be a part of it. Don't expect to have all the answers in the first week. It's a process.


