

GOSPEL

Matthew 2:1-12

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.

Solemnity of the Epiphany of our Lord / 2026

THERE'S SOMETHING ABOUT JESUS

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The first followers of Jesus, as well as the first generation of Christians knew that there was something about Jesus. In other words, there was something more to Jesus than what met the eye.

Their grasp of Jesus' identity may not have happened in a flash (conversion usually takes time and is a process) but certainly by the time the Gospels were being put to parchment, the first disciples of Jesus believed with all their hearts, and were even willing to stake their lives on it, that Jesus of Nazareth was also "the Christ, the Messiah of God."

Certainly the death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus the Christ opened their eyes and expanded their understanding of who Jesus was when He walked among them as one of them, who Christ was now in relationship with God the Father, and whom He had always been, pre-existent, before the creation of the world, the Divine Logos. "In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God" (Gospel of John 1:1).

There is a hint of this expanded understanding of Jesus' identity in the Gospel account that we call "the Epiphany" — known better as the visit of the Magi or 3 Kings or Wise Men. In their encounter with the infant Jesus, St. Matthew gives away the secret: Jesus is more than a baby. And Jesus is not just for the Jewish people. Jesus, salvation, is for the Jews and Gentiles.

In other words: we are, all of us, one in Christ. We are, as St. Paul phrases it to the Ephesians, "members of the same body." All of us, meaning, ALL of us, meaning every one and every thing is created in and through Christ. Talk about something more than meets the eye! This is the really big Epiphany.

"In the One, we are one!"



