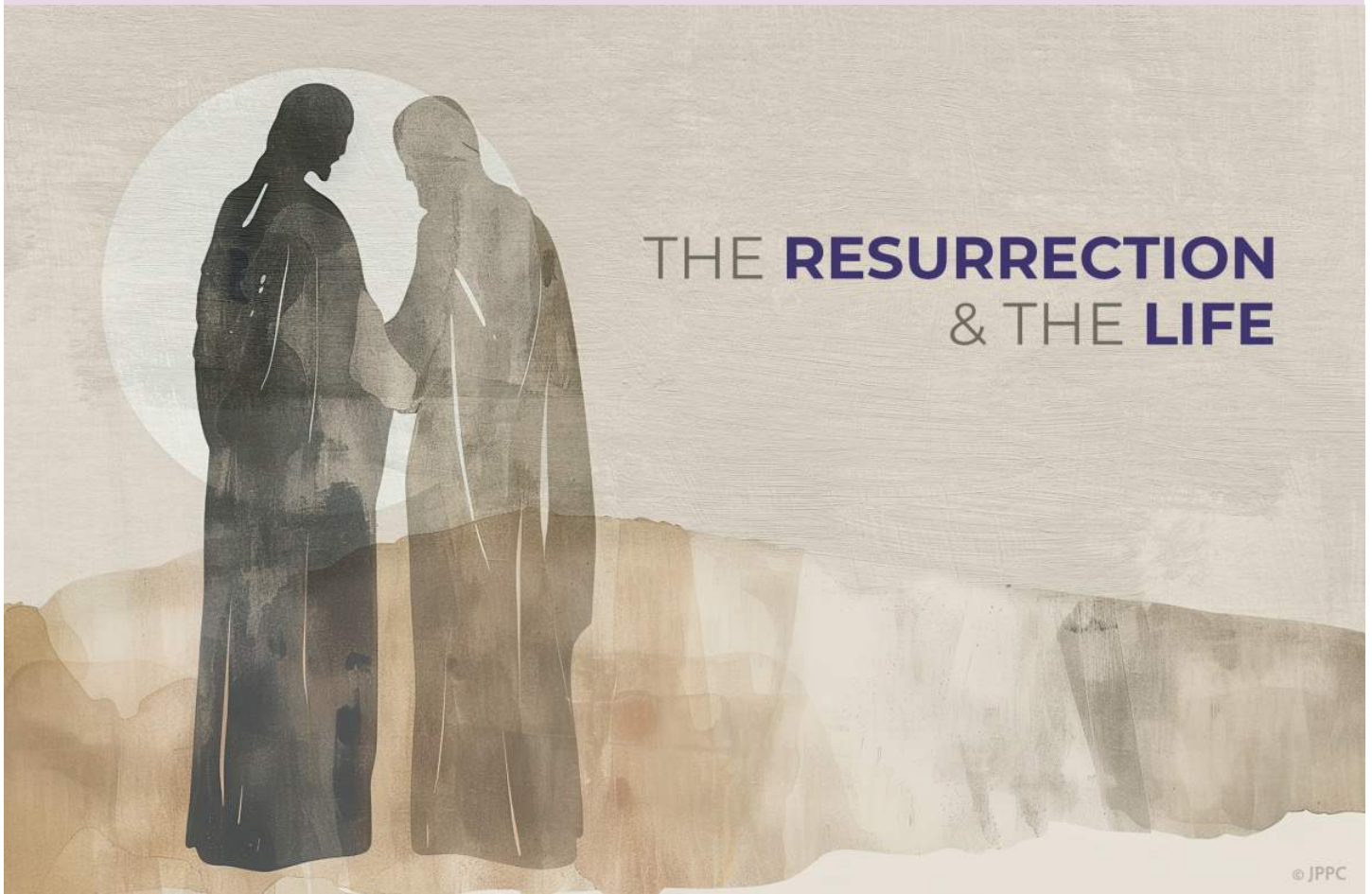

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT / 2026

Do Holy Week Intentionally

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Don't panic ... this isn't Holy Week, not yet. We've got the Fifth Week of Lent to journey through. Don't skip any days. Keep focused on your Lenten "program," keep praying on the attributes of Jesus, applying them to your life, your daily decisions and relationships.

But....

Don't go into Holy Week, which begins next Sunday (Palm Sunday), without a plan. Don't let it catch you off-guard.

Which Palm Sunday Mass will you participate in? How will Holy Week look and feel differently in your home? What activities can you eliminate to make room for more quiet, more prayer, for contemplation?

Plan to pray also with the community, with the parish, and with the Universal Church. This is OUR week. Try to join in the Church's liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter. These three days are to be lived as one. If you want to learn more about the meaning of these liturgies, please join me this Wednesday for a talk I call "The Days We Live For." These are the days also that give us Life. Knowing a little bit about them beforehand helps us to enter into them more fully.

Do Holy Week with thoughtfulness, prayerfulness and intentionality. I believe this will enrich and bring even more meaning and joy to your Easter Sunday! Remember: all of Lent is to help us prepare to rise with Christ on Easter, to live as the new creation we are in Christ!

“Lazarus, come out!” The words belong to Jesus. Could there be more freeing, hopeful words in the Bible! Lazarus, His friend, has died and been buried.

Hope is always born from trust. Jesus trusts that the Father is with Him. Jesus trusts that God’s Spirit always moves us toward life and love, toward deeper communion with God.

God does not want us to live entombed in darkness and death. This is contrary to God’s will, contrary to God’s nature.

God does not want us to live entombed alone, lonely and isolated. This is contrary to God’s will, contrary to God’s nature.

God does not want us to live entombed in fear and anxiety.

God does not want us to live entombed in anger, hatred, rage, bitterness. It is not living. It is contrary to God’s nature.

There is something on the other side of the tomb ... whatever tomb we bury ourselves in. This is the message of Jesus. “Lazarus, come out” is another way to say, “Follow me,” the first words Jesus spoke in His ministry.

Our hope is rooted in the promise that there is something on the other side of the tomb ... a love that embraces us and unites us and enlarges us. This is God’s will for us. This is God’s nature.

Lazarus, come out! George, come out! Abby, come out! Linda, come out! Max, come out! Everyone, come out, rise, live!

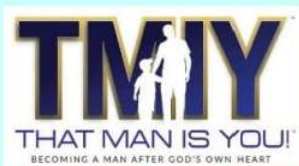
